Credit cards are widely accepted, but it's a good idea to carry some cash for smaller transactions and to tip service staff, usually around 15-20% of the bill.






International Airports

Logan International Airport, commonly referred to as Logan Airport, is the primary airport serving the city of Boston, Massachusetts, and the surrounding New England region. The airport was established in 1923 and is one of the oldest continuously operating airports in the United States. It has undergone numerous expansions and renovations over the years to accommodate the growing demand for air travel.

Logan Airport has four passenger terminals, namely Terminals A, B, C, and E. Each terminal serves different airlines and destinations, providing a wide range of domestic and international flights. Terminal E is dedicated primarily to international flights. Getting into Boston

Tickets can be purchased for specific durations, such as 1, 2, or 3 days, allowing travellers to customise their experience.




Hotel Options
